Mining and “*Le Nord pour tous*”

August 27, 28 and 29, 2013

On August 27 and 28, 2013, the FNQLSDI and the AFNQL will organize a two-day workshop on territories and resources. Two topics will be discussed: Bill 43 Mining Act and “*Le Nord pour tous*” (formerly *Le Plan Nord*).

Who should participate

Chiefs and individuals in charge of environmental or natural resource files in each First Nations community.

Objectives

Mining:

- Present, analyze and discuss Bill 43: Mining Act in preparation for special consultations and public hearings to be held in mid-September (Parliamentary Committee).
- Identify issues of concern related to the Quebec government (MNR) and companies in the mining sector and identify concrete solutions to propose.

Le Nord pour tous:

- Provide an overall picture of the “*Nord pour tous*”, including projects and future developments, but also the roles and mandates of the "Table of partners" and "Table of Aboriginal partners."
- Identify issues of concern related to the Quebec government for the development of the North.
